

N W Urban Indian Council Organizes

Several Indian and Alaskan Native Organizations throughout the Seattle area have incorporated the Northwest Urban Indian Council (NWUIC).

The NWUIC was formed to provide a unified consensus of Urban Indian and Alaskan Native Organizations concerns relative to the many issues affecting Indian country.

An overriding purpose of the NWUIC is to facilitate communication with and lend support to Regional and National Tribal Organizations like the: Small Tribes Organizations of Western

Washington, Affiliated Tribes of Northwest Indians, National Congress of American Indians, National Tribal Chairmans Association, and other National Indian Organizations such as the: United Indian Planners Association, American Indian Health Care Association, National Indian Education Association, National Advisory Council on Indian Education, Coalition of Indian Controlled School Boards, and any other Organization whose purposes are compatible with the NWUIC.

Members of the NWUIC will

conduct a caucus of Urban Organizations from the States of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Alaska and Montana at the 34th Annual National Congress of American Indians Convention at Dallas, Tex., Sept. 19-23.
