On August 12, 1968 Elim's new Native Co-op SUPERETTE building project commenced with a group of local men with shovels, picks and 'what-nots' digging an excavation 30 feet by 40 feet and 6 feet deep; a storage basement for our ex-

According to plans the SUPERETTE will feature as equipment and fixtures a power conveyor from basement to the main floor, gray tile floor, white tile ceiling, gondolas, fluorescent lighting, spot freezer and a space equipped for coffee-drinkers and visiting.
