

Bob Aloysius Appointed to Rights Comm.

JUNEAU— The appointment of Robert Aloysius, 32, of Fairbanks as a field representative for the Alaska State Commission for Human Rights has been announced by Gov. Walter J. Hickel.

Aloysius will be based in Fairbanks and will fill a position created by the Alaska Legislature in response to a request from the Governor that the commission staff be expanded.

Aloysius has lived in Fairbanks for the past five years, first during military service with the U. S. Army and most recently as a team captain for the Alaska State Commission Action Program. He was born in Aniak and raised on the Lower Yukon and Kuskokwim.

After graduation from Mt. Edgecumbe at Sitka, Aloysius studied at Western Washington College in Bellingham. In his new position he will work with Willard Bowman of Anchorage, director of the Human Rights Commission.
