The State of Alaska, Department of Natural Resources, has received revised materials in support of an application for a Surface Coal Mining Permit for the Diamond Churtha Mine. The revisions were submitted by Diamond Shamrock Churtha Coal Joint Venture (550 West Seventh Avenue, Suite 1800, Anchorage, AK, 99501), in response to the State's February 3, 1987 Decision which approved portions of the application and required other portions to be modified.

The permit application requests approval to develop a surface coal mine in the Salcha region of Upper Cook Inlet. The proposed mine has a maximum projected production of 12 million tons of coal per year. The project area is located on the northwest side of Cook Inlet, approximately 45 miles west of Anchorage, Alaska, and eleven miles northwest of Tyonek, Alaska. The proposed permit area includes the following lands, totaling approximately 3,595 acres:

The revised application materials include a topsoil storage and handling plan, a modified sediment and drainage control plan, and responses by the applicant to permit conditions included in the State's previous Decision. Assessments: The acceptance of less than fee interest for the community hall and utility assessments is determined to be appropriate in order to resolve ANCSA 14(c)(3) claims, 14(c)(3) claims and the claims to improved property by the Nelson Lake Corporation. It is also determined that the interests of a future city will not be prejudiced by this acceptance of less than fee title. This decision was reached after consultation with the village of Nelson Lake, through the recognized appropriate village entity, upon weighing the best interests of those residents and any municipal corporation which may be hereafter established in Nelson Lake and upon an application of the standards in 19 AAC 80.020.
