The State of Alaska, Department of Natural Resources, has received revised materials in support of an application for a Surface Coal Mining Permit for the Diamond Churtha Mine. The revisions were submitted by Diamond Shamrock Churtha Coal Joint Venture (550 West Seventh Avenue, Suite 1800, Anchorage, AK, 99501). In response to the State's February 3, 1987 Decision which approved portions of the application and required other portions to be modified.

The permit application requests approval to develop a surface coal mine in the Selkirk region of Upper Cook Inlet. The proposed mine has a maximum projected production of 12 million tons of coal per year. The project area is located on the northwest side of Cook Inlet, approximately 45 miles west of Anchorage, Alaska, and eleven miles northwest of Tyonek, Alaska. The proposed permit area includes the following lands, totaling approximately 3,595 acres:

Pursuant to Section 14(c)(3) of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA), 85 stat. 685, AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015 of the Municipal Trust Land Regulations, Nelson Lagoon Corporation has offered to convey the surface estate of the hereinafter described East Cemetery, School Site, Cemetery, Community Tract No. 1, Community Tract No. 2, Well Site, Landfill Site, Proposed Landfill Site, Roads, Airports, and Airport Access Road, a leasehold estate for the Community Hall and easements for a network of utility corridors to the State of Alaska, in trust, for any municipal corporation hereinafter established in the Village of Nelson Lagoon, Alaska:

5. Community Tract No. 2: A 17.04 acre tract including the waterline and community expansion area within the northeast quarter of Section 26, T48S, R77W, S.M.
6. Well Site: A .05 acre tract for an existing well adjacent to Polly Nelson's 14(c)(3) claim within the northeast quarter of Section 25, T48S, R77W, S.M.
7. Landfill Site: A .467 acre tract for an existing landfill within the northwest quarter of Section 25, T48S, R77W, S.M.
8. Proposed Landfill Site: A 2.5 acre tract for an existing landfill within the northeastern quarter of Section 25, T48S, R77W, S.M.
9. Roads: Nine existing village road easements and four proposed road easements connecting the above tracts.
10. Utility Easements: A network of 18 ten foot wide tracts of land to be used as utility easements within the northeast quarter of Section 25, T48S, R77W, S.M.
11. Community Hall Lease Site: A leasehold interest in a .26 acre tract for the community hall within the northeast quarter of Section 25, T48S, R77W, S.M.
12. Airport: An 88.1 acre tract of land for an existing airport within Sections 18 and 20, T48S, R77W, S.M.

This finding and determination are based on information from public sources and are subject to re-determination upon review by the Bureau of Land Management as required by 43 CFR 2803.3-4 and these amendments necessary to reflect the location of improvements. Adjustments or modifications may be required to conform with the findings of any surveys adjacent to or within the land that may be conveyed by Nelson Lagoon Corporation under the provisions of Section 14(c)(1), (2)

and (4) of ANCSA.

Pursuant to AS 44.47.150(a) and 19 AAC 90.015, the Municipal Land Trust Officer, acting on behalf of the Commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs, has decided to accept the above referenced offer in complete fulfillment of the obligation of Nelson Lagoon Corporation under Section 14(c)(3) of ANCSA, including the acceptance of less than fee interest for the aforementioned community hall and utility easements. The acceptance of less than fee interest for the community hall and utility easements is determined to be appropriate in order to resolve ANCSA 14(c)(1) claims, 14(c)(3) claims and the claim to improved property by the Nelson Lagoon Corporation. It is also determined that the interests of a future city will not be prejudiced by this acceptance of less than fee title. This decision was reached after consultation with the village of Nelson Lagoon, through the recognized appropriate village entity, upon weighing the best interests of those residents and any municipal corporation which may be hereinafter established in Nelson Lagoon and upon an application of the standards in 19 AAC 90.020.

This notice is being posted and published in accordance with the requirements of 19 AAC 90.015(c) and §10. The decision becomes final upon the expiration of 30 days following the publication of this notice, or after 30 days of continuous posting of this notice, whichever is later, unless the decision is appealed to the Commissioner in accordance with 19 AAC 90.940.

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF FILING

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION hereby gives notice that UNITED UTILITIES, INC. (UNITED), a telecommunications utility, has filed a tariff revision (TAB-249) which is a proposal to increase some of its recurring monthly rates and nonrecurring charges, to add rates and conditions for custom calling features (call forwarding, call waiting, conference calling, call back), to delete the present rates for customer requested directory changes and instead assess the service order charge for such charges, and to institute a charge of \$15.00 for checks returned as non-sufficient funds (NSF). UNITED states that its proposal results from the Commission's General Order No. 15 which required that all investor-owned utilities with taxable income in excess of \$100,000 file a tax computation and adjustment to rates incorporating the Tax Reform Act of 1986.

According to UNITED, incorporating the changes required by the tax reform act into the development of UNITED's local revenue requirement resulted in a revenue shortfall of \$295,068 for UNITED to achieve an 11% rate of return on rate base. UNITED estimates that its proposed tariff revision will generate an additional local service revenue of \$141,131 thereby providing a return on rate base of approximately 6.3%.
