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## Do you own an underground storage tank?

Has it been registered?



The Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) is compiling a statewide inventory of underground storage tanks (UST) containing petroleum products and other regulated substances. The purpose of the inventory is to locate and prevent potential leaks of gasoline and other chemicals from underground tanks which can contaminate

drinking water, cause explosions, or otherwise damage the environment.

Owners of such tanks are required by federal law to complete a notification form and return it to DEC by May 8, 1986. Anyone who knows of an abandoned underground tank should also notify the department. Some tanks, including those used to store home heating fuel, are exempt from the notification requirement. A complete list of exemptions is provided with notification forms which are available from DEC, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), and most major fire departments.

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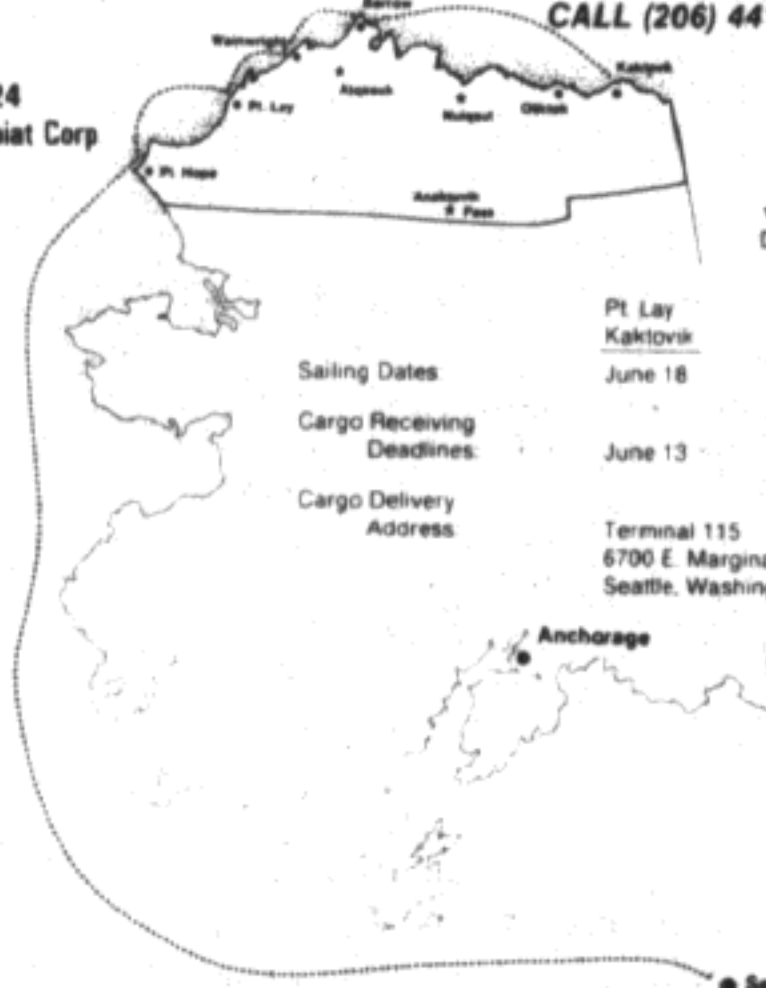

For Indian Owned & Controlled Enterprises

The Yupit Area School District will be accepting bids for the modification of the elementary schools located at Akiachak and Tuluklak, Alaska.

### I. Description

Work consists of miscellaneous modifications to the structure, mechanical and electrical systems to bring these facilities into compliance with the current requirements of the State Fire Marshals' and other various agencies.

A. Indian and non-Indian firms may bid on these projects; however, the projects are subject to Section 7(B) of the Indian Self Determination Act (Public law 93-638). Bids from non-Indian firms will be returned without being read if a contract can be awarded to an Indian bidder according to the provisions of the bid documents.

B. Non-Indian firms shall take specific affirmative actions to ensure equal employment opportunities.

C. Sealed bids in duplicate will be received until 2:00 PM, May 23, 1986, local time and then publicly opened and read in the offices of the Superintendent of Schools of the Yupit Area School District in Akiachak, Alaska.

D. A bid guaranty is required with each bid in the amount of 5% of the total bid.

E. Bids cannot be withdrawn for 30 calendar days subsequent to the bid openings. The owner

reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

### II. Bonds

The successful bidder will be required to furnish a performance bond and labor and material bond in the amount of 100% of the contract price.

### III. Completion

Substantial completion and beneficial occupancy of the facilities shall be by August 15, 1986. Final completion shall be by October 1, 1986.
