

Six Alaskan Villages Awarded Grants for Community Projects

JUNEAU— Rural Development Agency grants totalling \$41,980 have been awarded to six Alaskan communities, according to an announcement from the Office of Governor Keith H. Miller.

The Village of Deering will use a \$7,500 grant to dismantle, move and re-establish a surplus building for use as a community center.

The citizens of St. Mary's will construct stage one of a community water system funded by a \$10,000 RDA grant.

The Village of Selawick has received \$7,500 to fund the moving of a surplus building from Cape Lisbourne to Selawick for use as a community center.

The City of Wrangell has received \$10,000 for construction of a city center and community hall. Materials will be furnished by the city with the grant monies paying for the labor.

The village of Mekoryuk was funded for a trail staking project.

Port Graham has been granted \$6,500 for completion of a road and work at the village airport.
