

CITC sponsors Native youth conference

The Sixth Annual Native Youth Leadership Conference will be held April 23-29 at Meier Lake, 50 miles north of Anchorage.

The theme for the conference is "Passing the Flame to Future Leaders."

The year's conference is oriented toward teaching leadership skills to the participants and implementing those newly learned skills during the sessions.

Workshop topics include subsistence, 1991, goal setting, resolutions and drug/alcohol abuse.

Anchorage's Native Youth Leadership Council is hosting the annual conference, with council members actively involved in preparations for the event.

Council members will facilitate workshop sessions and serve as emcees throughout the conference.

The Native Youth Leadership Council is sponsored by the Cook Inlet Tribal Council's Johnson-O'Malley Program. The AFN Youth Council also will be reporting to the conference participants.

Registration is open to students in the seventh through the 12th grades, but space is limited. The cost for the three-day conference is \$150 for each person. Lodging, meals and conference materials are included in the fee.
