O'Dowd announces selection of Lind for Southeast position

University of Alaska President Donald O'Dowd announced recently that Marshall Lind has been selected chancellor for the unit of the University of Alaska which will serve Southeast Alaska after UA is restructured.

Lind most recently served as commissioner of education, on loan to the Alaska Department of Education from the University of Alaska-Juneau where he is dean of extended and graduate study.

Lind will assume his new duties some time this month, but prior to that he will visit some of the outlying Southeast communities which will be served by the new unit of the university which he will head.

From 1971 to 1983, Lind was commissioner of education for the state. Prior to that, he served as superintendent of the Kodiak Island Borough School District.

Before earning his doctorate at Northwestern University in Illinois in 1969, Lind served as teacher, principal teacher and area supervisor for the Bureau of Indian Affairs in Kwigillingok, Goodnews Bay and Emmonak.

He earned his master of education degree from the University of Montana and his bachelor of science degree from the University of Wisconsin.
