

## State Senator at 25—

# UA Nominates Sen. Miller As Outstanding Young Man

FAIRBANKS—The University of Alaska nominated State Sen. Terry Miller (R-Fairbanks) for selection as one of America's Ten Outstanding Young Men of 1969. Miller, a graduate of UA, is

the youngest state senator in Alaska's history. He was elected to the office last fall at age 25.

UA's President William R. Wood announced the nomination. He said, "We take obvious pride in the fact one of our 1965 graduates now serves in the State Senate."

"Miller's achievement at age 26 is truly remarkable. Even more remarkable are the maturity and intelligence with which he serves government in Alaska."

America's Ten Outstanding

Young Men awards are made each year by the U.S. Jaycees. U.S. Rep. Howard Pollock (R-Alaska) received the award in 1955.

Miller chairs the Senate Judiciary Committee and sits on the Senate Finance Committee. He was elected to the State House at age 23 and served as North Star Borough Assembly president at 21.

## Pat Locke Clarifies Employment Position

Patricia (Pat) Locke, who formerly directed the Anchorage Native Welcome Center, wishes her position clarified she currently holds in Brigham City, Utah.

Pat Locke said that in a recent issue and story in the Tundra Times regarding Terry Booth, who was appointed ANWC director, there was a line stating that Pat Locke had left Alaska to work for the Bureau of Indian

Affairs.

She said this was wrong. "I am employed as an Indian Education Curriculum Development Specialist by a private consulting firm, ABT Associates, out of Cambridge, Mass.," Pat Locke writes.

She said the special program is Project NECESSITIES being done on a contract basis with the Department of Education of the BIA.

"We are writing some very exciting social studies curriculum—Eskimo, Indian and Aleut—specific material that will appeal to and stimulate our children," Pat Locke stated. "It's about time, isn't it, that native educators wrote school curriculum for native children?"

She said the curricula will be tested and used in public (state operated schools), religious (mission) and BIA schools.

She added that Rep. William (Willie) Hensley of Kotzebue is also on the Steering Committee of the Project NECESSITIES.
