Victory High School is located at Mile 95 on the Glenn Highway, east of Palmer. The school is sponsored by Arctic Missions, Inc.

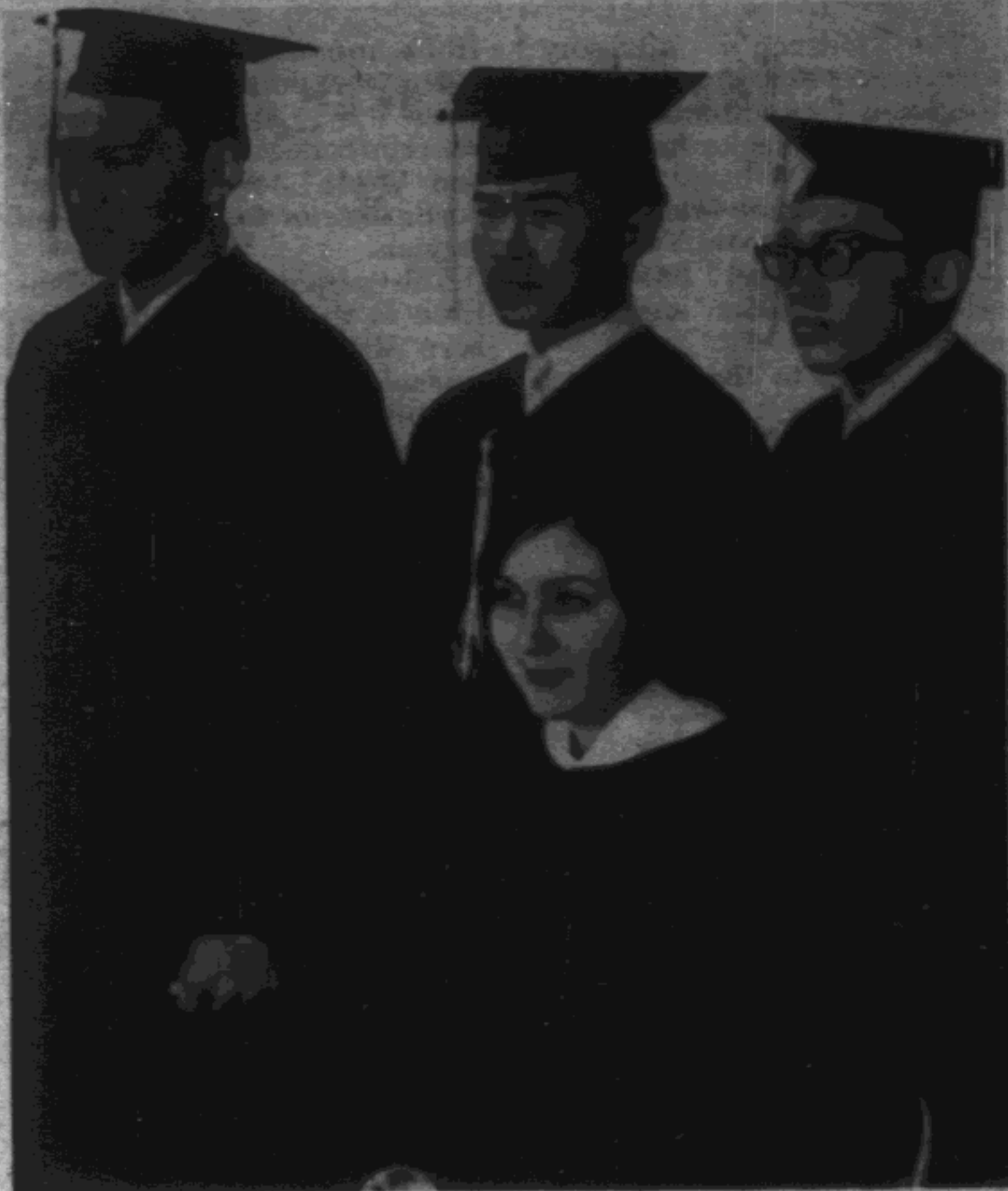
It is a boarding school since all but two of the 30 students come from several different villages scattered about Alaska.

They attend Victory High School, not only for the academic courses offered, but also for the Christian training available.

All four graduates plan to attend the Arctic Bible Institute beginning next September. Arctic Bible Institute is located on the same campus with Victory High School.

Its purpose is to offer Native young people training in Bible and related subjects in preparation for Christian service among their own people in the villages of Alaska.
