

Dr. Soboleff Tells UA Graduates They Have 'Kingly Responsibility'

The University of Alaska's Class of 1968 was given "a kingly responsibility" at Baccalaureate services last Sunday.

Referring to Proverbs, the Rev. Walter A. Soboleff of Juneau told the graduates "it is the glory of God to conceal things, but the glory of kings is to search things out."

He reminded them "it is the honor and privilege of manking to find treasures concealed in the universe."

Dr. Soboleff, grand president of the Alaska Native Brotherhood and evangelist for the Alaska Presbytery, delivered his Baccalaureate sermon in the university's Patty Building before an audience of more than 600

graduates, faculty and guests.

The musical selection, "Make a Joyful Noise Unto the Lord" by Lekberg, was sung by the university's Choir of the North, directed by Prof. Charles Davis.

The invocation was offered by the Rev. Bill P. White, pastor of the Church of God, Ketchikan, and the benediction given by the Rev. William Heynen, pastor of the Trinity Christian Reformed Church, Anchorage.

Prof. William R. Cashen, UA marshal, led the processional of regents, faculty and graduates from the University Commons to the Patty Building.
