

Bethel Gets Set for Arts, Crafts Fair

Bethel is now preparing for its Arts and Crafts Fair to be held Jan. 17 and 18 and requests that all entries be in by Jan. 9, 1970.

Each item should be marked with the name of the person who made it, the name of the village and the price—if it is for sale.

All items not for sale should be so marked.

Prizes will be awarded in each

of the following classes: Basketry—birch bark, spruce root, split willow, saltwater grass; Sculpture and Carvings—wood, ivory, soapstone, models and miniatures, sleds and boats; Masks—skin, wood, bone, ivory; Graphics—sketches, oils, photography, skin drawings; Dolls—wood, ivory, fur; Skin Sewing—mukluks, mittens, hats, parkas, headbands, slippers; Miscellaneous—beadwork, kus-

puks, pottery and ceramics, knitted items, utensils.

An article of traditional value to Eskimo culture will be selected and bought for the Bethel Museum—price not to exceed \$50.

Running concurrently with the fair will be the annual Winter Carnival at Bethel.
