

J. Saylor Stalks Plane Hunters

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Congressman John P. Saylor (R-Pa.) recently was joined by Congressman David Obey (D-Wisc.) in introducing a bill that would put a stop to the so-called "sport" where men hunt species of wildlife from airplanes.

In a speech to his colleagues in the House, the Pennsylvania conservationist and hunter said, "incredible as it may sound, roaming loose in this country is a certain low breed of the genus

homo sapien who goes 'hunting' from an airplane."

The Congressman credited the television documentary, "The Wolf Men" for bringing the matter to the nation's attention when it showed such activity being practiced in Alaska.

He continued, "I have learned that another low breed of human has started to 'hunt' eagles from airplanes. Such activity churns the stomach."

Congressman Saylor, ranking Minority Member of the House Interior & Insular Affairs Committee, also said, "while I was in my district—hunting—during the Thanksgiving recess, a number of my constituents vehemently expressed their revulsion at such 'sport.' In no uncertain terms they said to me, 'you are a conservationist—do something to stop it!! That is exactly what our bill will do.'"
