In reference to the May 16 article:

Last January, when I presented the resolution requesting the campus president be evaluated to deal with existent management conflicts, it was with the full support of the Nome Eskimo Community Council. The resolution was initiated by members of the Nome Eskimo Community and I acted as spokesperson. However, the

conflicts were brought to my attention by other NWCC Council members, people within the City of Nome as well as representatives of the entire region.

As a result, the evaluation committee was formed with the intent to resolve the conflicts at the Council level. During the various work sessions, the evaluation committee became aware that a guideline was necessary to evaluate not only the present campus president, but future ones as well; toward this end progress was made, but the management conflicts were not resolved.

The ensuing resolution of no-confidence in the campus president was exercised as a final alternative by twelve of the fifteen

members Council under the Community College Rural Education and Extension policies. This resolution was initiated by members of the Council other than myself, with my supporting vote.

I am pleased to see that the members of the Northwest Community College Council have taken an active role in developing an evaluation consistent with the goals and objectives of the institution. This shows that the Council members are accepting accountability towards running a responsible regional community college.
