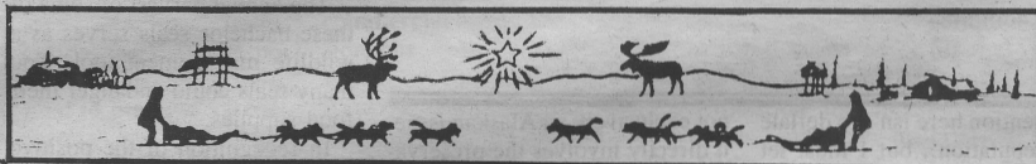
Prior to entering helicopter flight training, you must successfully complete basic training and pre-flight training.
