

Special Funds

The government has released special funds to transport Alaska Natives from remote villages to job training centers for pipeline construction work, Sen. Ted Stevens said recently.

The senator said the Office of Management and Budget has approved reprogramming of \$389,000 for the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide transportation to job training sites. The funds came from allotments originally made for welfare and employment assistance programs.

Although federal and state agencies have set up programs to train Alaska natives for pipeline jobs, Stevens said, "Progress has been delayed due to lack of funds to bring the natives from the villages to training centers."

He said the budgetary switch should solve the problem this year, and hopefully next year's appropriation will include necessary transportation funds.

Millions in Contracts

ANCHORAGE — The total value of the trans-Alaska pipeline construction contracts announced by Alyeska Pipeline Service Company is in the neighborhood of \$545 million, excluding materials, according to an Alyeska spokesman.

A breakdown of the approximate costs of the individual contracts is as follows: Arctic Constructors, Segments 5 and 6, 223 miles, \$130 million; Asso-

ciated-Green, Segment 4, 127 miles, \$80 million; H.C. Price Segment 3, 152 miles; \$130 million; Perini Arctic Associates, Segment 2, 149 miles, \$80 million; and Morrison-Knudsen Co., Segment 1, 145 miles, \$125 million.
