

LEGAL NOTICE

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA STATE OPERATED SCHOOL SYSTEM

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska State Operated School System, under authority vested by AS 14.08.20(5) and AS 14.14.170(e) and AS 14.14.200 proposes to adopt regulations for publications in the Alaska Administrative Code to implement AS 14.03.030, 14.03.080, 14.08.060, 14.08.090, 14.09.010(c), 14.14.170, 14.14.200, 14.30.010, 14.331010, 44.62.310.

Proposed regulations concern the following:

1. Statements of educational goals of the Alaska State Operated School System, standards for the educational program for the Alaska State Operated School System, policy and standards for the utilization and performance of staff, incorporation by reference of the bylaws adopted by the Board of Directors at the July 1974 meeting.

2. District operation and organization as follows:

Advisory committees to the Board of Directors, a district budget advisory committee, budget hearings and reviews, long-range planning for facilities, establishing new schools and secondary programs, education in lieu of an established school the establishment of a district policy advisory council, board meeting agendas, taping of board meetings, minutes of board meetings, public speakers, media relations and public relations, supplementary appropriations for capital improvements, community use of school facilities, gifts to schools, mechanisms for complaints about school facilities personnel local policy, regional and district policies, and text books and materials; length of school day, school calendar, emergency closing of schools, intermediate or regional administrative units, levels of instruction and grade groupings, school census, ceremonies and observances, solicitations of students and staff, advertising in the schools, public dedication and naming of new schools, instructional materials selection, learning support systems contributing to learning activities library/media centers, professional libraries, use of school short wave radios,

school busses and services shared with other school districts.

3. Proposed advisory school board regulations concern the following:

Establishment of advisory school boards advisory board elections, advisory board member resignations and removal from office, advisory board member unexpired term fulfillment, advisory board members legal status, methods of advisory school board advice and assistance to the Board of Directors including local board policy making, duties of advisory school board members, advisory board member development opportunities, conduct of advisory board members, annual review of advisory board procedures, advisory board annual reports, advisory board membership in school board associations, advisory board officers and their duties, advisory board code of ethics, advisory board records, advisory board consultants, advisory board committees, advisory board relationships to rural and on base regional superintendents and rural principals.

4. Regulations covering the following matters are proposed for students:

Tuancy, entrance requirements for underage children, school admissions requirements, policies on adult, foreign exchange, pregnant and married students, absences and excuses, assignments to classes, acceleration ahead of grade, graduation requirements, student fees, fines and charges, work study, employment student social events, field trips and excursions, student safety patrols, student insurance programs, solicitations by students, staff solicitations of students, student volunteers for public service, community activities and performances by students, contest for students, interviews by non-school persons of students.

5. Regulations concerning the following are proposed for employees:

Selection procedures for on-base and regional superintendents, staff political activities, solicitations by staff members, gifts to staff members, tutoring for pay.
