Sealed bids in single copy for furnishing all labor, materials and equipment, and performing all work on Project RF-071-1(27), Richardson Highway, Sheep Creek to Thompson Pass described herein, will be received until 2:00 p.m. prevailing time, August 29, 1974 in the Commissioner's Office, Department of Highways, Island Center Building, Douglas, Alaska.

This project will consist of grading and drainage on 5.3 miles of roadway between Icy Point and Thompson Pass, and crushed aggregate base and asphalt surface treatment on 7.5 miles of roadway between Sheep Creek and Thompson Pass. The project is located near Valdez, Alaska.

Principal items of work consist of the following: 63 acres of clearing and grubbing; 1,300,000 cubic yards of unclassified excavation; 74,000 cubic yards of selected material; 665,000 yard miles of haul; 2,700 cubic yards of structure excavation; 58,000 tons of crushed aggregate base; 45,000 tons of subbase A; 601 tons of emulsified asphalt surface treatment; and 4,800 tons of cover coat material; 2,300 linear feet of 24" corrugated steel pipe, 12,500 linear feet of cable type guard rail; 199 square feet of standard sign; and miscellaneous items of work.

All work shall be completed in 300 calendar days.

The Department of Highways anticipates the reconstruction of the road from Central to Circle Hot Springs, Project S-0670(16).

In compliance with Title 23, U.S. Code, an Opportunity for a Corridor and Design Public Hearing for the above described project is being offered at this time. The proposed project would reconstruct the roadway to a 28 foot wide surface. The project is 7.8 miles long and completely follows the existing alignment except for a slight shift (approximately 4,500 feet from the junction of the Steese Highway and the Circle Hot Springs Road) to allow for a standard curvature. The shift would move the centerline approximately 150 feet to the left. Residents along the route near Central will not be adversely affected because the subgrade is relatively stable and only minor widening is planned.

The purpose of a Corridor and Design Public Hearing is to afford interested individuals and organizations an opportunity to familiarize themselves with location and design details of the project plans as developed by the Department of Highways and to express their views and opinions on these plans. An Environmental Assessment has been prepared and is available for inspection at the above address.

It is suggested that such interested persons may wish to visit the Department of Highways at the above address to see the plans for the project before making written request for a public hearing.
