

Hoffman seeks top post at TCC

Dee Olin Hoffman, 39, a former mayor of Ruby and a former newspaper publisher has announced her candidacy for president of the Tanana Chiefs Conference.

Hoffman is also a former chairman of the subsistence committee of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program board. In addition, Hoffman served as president and executive director of the Koyukon Development Corp., administering village agricultural and local hire programs for 16 Interior villages.

Hoffman is currently a director of the Doyon Ltd. board. She is an Athabascan born in Tanana. She has a masters degree in public administration from the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University.

She is married to David Hoffman, commissioner of the Department of Community and Regional Affairs. She is the mother of four children.
