## Bethel fuel worskshop held for villagers

The State of Alaska, Division of Energy and Power Development, and Standard Oil Company joined forces recently to sponsor a Fuel Management Training Workshop that was held in Bethel on March 22-4, 1977, for several of the villages in that region.

"Many of the students had been smoking around fuel tanks and leaving the valves open with children in the area without really realizing the dangers involved. The Standard Oil trainer. Larry Dempster, showed a film of an actual fuel fire which cost the lives of several fireman. The students were able to see how fire spread and eventually how they put that fire out. It made a great impact on the students."

The division of Energy and Power Development, within the Department of Commerce and Economic Development has worked with rural energy problems statewide, according to the Division's director, Bill Mc-Conkey.
