IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE
DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Revenue, under the Authority vested in AS 43.05.00 and 43.23.060(3), proposes to amend regulations in Title 15 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with Permanent Fund Dividends, to implement AS 43.23, as follows:

(1) 15 AAC 23.01 is amended as follows:

The filing deadline for Alaska State Dividend Certificates will be September 1st of the year for which the dividend is claimed. When September 1st is on a Saturday, Sunday or other legal holiday, the deadline will be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.

(2) 15 AAC 23.02 is amended as follows:

Applications for Permanent Fund Dividends submitted on behalf of incapacitated persons may be signed by the parent or other relative or by the official in charge of a public or private agency having custody of the incapacitated person.

(3) 15 AAC 23.04(i) is amended as follows:

A person who is absent from the state for more than 180 days for purposes of vacation, conducting business on his own behalf or on the behalf of one's employer, and who is presumed to not be a resident of the state for the year in which the absence occurred.

(4) 15 AAC 23.04 is amended as follows:

A person within the custody of the state but who is not physically present in the state has an allowable absence.

(5) 15 AAC 23.06 is amended as follows:

An applicant may not charge a fee for the payment of a dividend payment after the application has been filed.
