PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION

Notice is hereby given that the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation under authority vested by AS 46.03.020(1)(a), AS 46.03.020(1)(b), AS 46.03.050, AS 46.03.070, AS 46.03.080 proposes to revise regulations in Title 18 of the Alaska Administrative Code, chapter 70, to implement, interpret, and make specific the water quality provisions of Alaska Statutes Title 46. A summary of the proposed revisions to water quality regulations follows:

Section 10 Water Quality Standards This section contains rules but does not change the intent of how the water quality standards are presently applied.

Section 20 Establishment of Water Use Classifications and Criteria The water use classifications have been revised somewhat to more clearly identify the uses of Alaskan waters. The criteria necessary to maintain these use classifications have been modified accordingly and reflect the results of more recent scientific studies.

Section 30 Procedure for Applying Water Quality Criteria Relatively minor modifications have been made to more clearly define the boundaries to use in applying the water quality criteria.

Section 32 Mixing Zones This section contains the mixing zone requirements presently contained in Section 30 and expands on the criteria to be used in their application.

Section 34 Use of Pesticides This section was added to provide a mechanism for allowing the controlled use of pesticides around an aquatic environment.

Section 36 Thermal Discharge This section was added to allow for those instances where a heated effluent will not be detrimental or, may be beneficial to the aquatic environment.

Section 40 Natural Conditions This section was consolidated into Section 10 and clarifies that these water quality criteria apply only to manmade alterations to the waters of the State.

Section 50 Classification of State Waters All previously classified waters of the state would have their water use classification provided for in accordance with the new use designations. As a result of those changes some minor upgrading was made in the classification for lower ship creek. In addition, waters protected by the "Anadromous Fish Act" (AS 16.05.970) have been included in the "growth and propagation of fish" water use designation.

Section 55 Petition for Reclassification Although the existing regulations presently provide for the reclassification of the state to be reclassified, this new section establishes a very detailed procedure for doing so and represents a major addition to these regulations.

Section 58 Reclassification Criteria This new section provides detailed criteria to be used in determining whether to change the classification of a particular body of water to another use designation.

Section 60 Minimum Treatment This section is being moved to the Wastewater Disposal Regulations (18 AAC 72) and modified to include provisions for allowing water treatment secondary treatment requirements as detailed in the Clean Water Act of 1977.

Sections 81, 82, 83, 84 and 85 These sections deal with the procedures the department followed in certifying Federal permits. On November 25, 1977, the department promulgated Administrative Procedure Regulations (18 AAC 15) which consolidated all of the department permit and certification procedures into one regulation. Section 81, 82, 83, 84 and 85 were incorporated into these new regulations and are thus being eliminated from the Water Quality Regulations.

Section 90 Implementation and Enforcement Plan This section is being moved to the Wastewater Disposal Regulations (18 AAC 72) and modified to include the new rules for achieving minimum treatment as specified in the Clean Water Act of 1977.

Section 100 Penalties This section is being repealed because the penalties for noncompliance have been added to various chapters already established in State statutes.
