NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE RECORD'S COMMISSION ON THE ADMINISTRATION

OF JUSTICE

Notice is hereby given that the Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice, under authority vested by AS 12.62, proposes to amend regulations under Title 6 of the Alaska Administrative Code to further implement AS 12.62 in conformity with regulations promulgated by the United States Department of Justice appearing in 28 CFR, Part 20 and in order to facilitate and regulate the exchange of criminal justice information and to insure the security and privacy of criminal justice information systems in Alaska, as follows:

6 AAC 60.015, "Criminal Justice Information Systems," is amended as follows:

ARTICLE 1. COLLECTION AND STORAGE OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION

6 AAC 60.010. SCOPE OF REGULATIONS. This section is amended to extend the coverage of these regulations to manually maintained files containing criminal offender record information which have been partially or fully funded by the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration.

6 AAC 60.015. ALASKA JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM. This section constitutes a new section which makes it clear that the Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice is the authority responsible for implementation and administration of these regulations. In addition, the section provides for an Alaska Justice Information System Coordinator with responsibility for ensuring that all criminal justice information systems in Alaska operate in compliance with AS 12.62 and with the provisions of these regulations.

ARTICLE 2. SECURITY

6 AAC 60.030. SEGREGATION OF COMPUTERIZED FILES AND THEIR LINKAGE TO INVESTIGATORY FILES. This section is amended to establish the Alaska Justice Information System Coordinator as the person responsible for system security and program documentation and control. In addition, the section exempts the Alaska Justice Information System from the requirement that the computer system be exclusively dedicated to law enforcement use as provided in AS 12.62.040(1).

6 AAC 60.040. AGENCY SECURITY. This section is amended to integrate input and update authority pertaining to the screening of personnel with access to criminal justice information and to provide for a means to terminate or transfer an employee who violates AJIS security requirements.

ARTICLE 3. ACCESS AND USE

6 AAC 60.050. INPUT AND UPDATE. This section is amended to reorganize input and update authority granted to sub-divisions of the Department of Public Safety into a single category applicable to the department as a whole and to include the Alaska Board of Parole as an agency with authority to input and update specific categories of criminal justice information. In addition, a new subsection is added to reflect the requirement contained in the federal regulations that criminal history records contain dispositions within 90 days after the disposition has occurred.

6 AAC 60.060. ACCESS. This section is also amended to reorganize categories of access authority granted to subdivisions of the Department of Public Safety into a single category applicable to the department as a whole. In addition, the Alaska Board of Parole and the Child Support Enforcement Agency of the Department of Revenue are added as agencies with authority to access specified categories of criminal justice information.

6 AAC 60.070. RESTRICTIONS ON DISSEMINATION OF CRIMINAL OFFENDER RECORD INFORMATION. This section is amended to permit dissemination of conviction information to non-criminal justice agencies only when necessary for the enforcement or administration of other provisions of law. In addition, the section prohibits verification of the existence or non-existence of criminal offender record information, requires secondary users to sign contractual agreements which detail security and confidentiality standards, provides a central repository for criminal offender record information and exempts certain types of information, which have traditionally been treated as public records such as police blotters and delinquent records, from the coverage of the regulations.

6 AAC 60.080. INDIVIDUAL'S RIGHT TO INFORMATION. This section is amended to: allow an individual to obtain a copy of records pertaining to him; require necessary for purposes of challenging its correctness or when the information relates only to driving records; provides an individual whose record has been successfully challenged with a means of determining whether non-law enforcement agencies have received incorrect information; and requires that criminal justice agencies in other jurisdictions who may have received incorrect information be notified within ten days of a correction.

ARTICLE 4. PURGING OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE

INFORMATION

6 AAC 60.100. PURGING OF CRIMINAL OFFENDER RECORD INFORMATION. This section is amended to clarify purging requirements and to change the time period between the time a record is closed and the time its contents are expunged from one year to sixty days. In addition, the section provides a means for implementing the federal requirements that records reflect dispositions within ninety days from the date of the disposition. The time period for closure of misdemeanor records is altered from five years to seven years to correspond to the provisions of AS 12.55.145 of the revised criminal code relating to the period of time a prior conviction can be considered for sentencing.

6 AAC 60.120. NOTIFICATION OF PURGING AND REQUESTS FOR COMPLIANCE. This section is amended to provide for an alternate procedure under subsection (c) for the requirement that notice be furnished on each occasion that criminal justice information has been expunged, closed or reopened. The alternate procedure will permit the requirement of notice be satisfied through the inclusion of a notation on a record at the time of its dissemination which will be within ninety days of the expunged or closed date.

6 AAC 60.130. FORMULATION OF PROCEDURES. This section is amended to integrate audit and control requirements into the regulations as recommended in the Alaska Privacy and Security Plan prepared under the direction of the Department of Public Safety.

6 AAC 60.140. DEFINITIONS. This section is amended to add definitions of "Alaska Justice Information System Coordinator" and "central repository." In addition, the section amends the definition of "closed," "Criminal justice information system" and "criminal offender record information."

Notice is also given that any person interested may present oral or written statements or arguments relevant to the action proposed at a hearing to be held by the Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice at the Boney Memorial Court Building, Anchorage, Alaska, at 7:00 o'clock p.m., on June 26, 1979.

Copies of the proposed regulations are being distributed to all affected law enforcement agencies, the Alaska Court System, the Alaska Department of Law, the Alaska Division of Corrections, law libraries, bar associations and incumbent state legislators. Persons not able to attend the above scheduled hearing who wish to submit written statements relevant to the proposed action should forward them to the address indicated above by June 20, 1979.

The Governor's Commission on the Administration of Justice, upon its own motion or at the instance of any interested person, may at its public meeting in Anchorage on June 26, 1979, or after, adopt the proposed regulations substantially as described above without further notice or may decide to take no action on them.
