This July, the Alaska Native Human Resource Development Program (ANHRDP) will be providing computer camps designed for rural Alaskan students and professionals. Computer camps are an unparalleled opportunity to combine basic or advanced training by University staff with the stimulation that comes only from interacting and learning with people from a variety of geographic and cultural backgrounds.

Candidates must be at least 12 years old, and have a strong interest in some facet of computers or computer applications. The ANHRDP will provide instruc-

tion for beginners and experienced users in areas ranging from accounting, animation, basic programming, communications, graphics, hardware, trouble shooting, and word processing.

The ANHRDP is a part of the University of Alaska Cooperative Extension Service. They provide assistance to village corporations and local governments in selection and operation of micro-computer systems.
