Application forms for Senator Stevens' summer intern program for graduating high school seniors have been sent to every Alaska high school, the Senator's Washington, D.C., office announced on March 14.

Seniors about to graduate who wish to be considered for one of the two four-week sessions may obtain the application forms through their high school principals.

The first session is scheduled from June 10 to July 5; the second session will be July 8 through August 2.

Stevens, the program offers young Alaskans the opportunity to work in the Senator's Washington, D.C., office. Interns assist the Senator and staff members in providing legislative and constituent services. The interns' assignments could include research, monitoring committee hearings, answering telephones, typing, filing, carrying messages or stuffing envelopes.

"The primary purpose of the intern program is to give young Alaskans a greater understanding of our national government and the concerns of those we serve at home," Stevens said. The pro-

gram also affords the opportunity to visit national shrines and historic sites in the Washington, D.C., area, the Senator noted.

Interns receive a small salary. They pay for their housing and normal living expenses. The Senator's Washington, D.C., office aranges for suitable housing at a resonable fee, usually on the campus of American University.

Application forms may also be obtained from Senator Steven's offices in Anchorage, Fairbanks, Juneau, Kenai, Ketchikan, Kodiak and Nome. The forms must be postmarked no later than April 5.
