

Canada North Development Man Appointed

The post of Assistant Deputy Minister for Economic Development will be filled November 1 by a Quebec-born man with many years service in public life.

Jean-Baptiste Bergevin, 45, comes to the position from Quebec City where he held various provincial government positions which included until recently his work as Assistant Deputy Minister of Agriculture and Colonization in charge of administering the Agricultural Rehabilitation and Development Act.

In his new position, Bergivin is responsible for the new program of economic development for Indians and for those programs directed toward the economic development of the Northern Territories.

Among his previous positions, Bergevin served in 1959 on the Technical Assistance Board of the United Nations and in this capacity helped to establish a national accounts system and the preparation of an economic development plan for Tunisia.
