



Tyonek gets a new ambulance. Al Goozmer, president of IRA tribal council of Tyonek says the new ambulance "is going to be something great." Goozmer describes the old ambulance as a "100-year-old Cadillac which spends an average of two days a week in the shop." With the new vehicle, the EMTs should be much more effective in responding to calls, Goozmer said. The ambulance cost \$43,322 which was the result of a trilateral agreement between the two branches of the state legislature and the governor's office.
