A Message from Eben Hopson

The North Slope Borough Capital Improvements Program:

Anaktuvuk Pass



Anaktuvuk Pass: Educational Facilities, Phase II. Designed by Alley-Haig, Inc., Architects. To be completed by fall, 1980. Projected cost: \$6.99 million.

Mixed success characterized our first attempts at capital improvements in Anaktuvuk Pass. The bridge and creek channeling efforts were mainly successful, but more diking is scheduled for Contact Creek. The dome structures were failures as heated structures, but can be used as bulk cold storage when the new school is completed. The latest electrical generation system will serve the village as a basis for Phase II project which will include the permanent generator structure and additional generation for the immediate future.

Anaktuvuk Pass can expect a significant level of construction for the next few years with construction of a major new school shown in the picture above and a support system including water and sewage systems, power generation, fuel tanks, access roads, an enlarged runway, and housing for teachers and workers.

Carefully planned and scheduled, these projects will assure availability of work and a general upgrading of Anaktuvuk's lifestyle over a period of many years. The work may seem slow because of the preconstruction tasks such as land acquisition and utility and access development. But if the preliminary tasks are done properly, costs can be reduced and facilities will be better adapted to long-term village needs.
