## CITC seeks 100 Native youth for job program

Applications from high school students are currently being accepted for the Cook Inlet Tribal Council Summer Youth Employment Program.

The deadline for applying for work

is May 20.

The program is funded through the Department of Labor's Job Training Partnership Act. The grant enables CITC to pay the salaries and benefits of 100 Alaska Native students between the ages of 14 to 21.

The wage paid to the student is \$5 per hour. If transportation is a problem for students, CITC will pay for a People Mover bus pass until students receive their first pay check.

Job sites will consist of 30 jobs located in the villages of Knik, Ninilchik, Salamantoff, Seldovia and Tyonek, which leaves 70 job openings

in the Anchorage area.

1990 job sites will possibly include the Alaska Railroad, which may have 20 student openings available; the U.S. Forest Service which may have two openings; the Tundra Times Newspaper, which may have one position available for a student who is sincere about a career in journalism or newspaper production; the Anchorage Police Department, which may have a position available for one student serious about this field of work. Other job sites include Hope Cottages, the Alaska Native Medical Center, the National Guard and the Louise Rude Center.
