STATE OF ALASKA NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FT. YUKON AIRPORT IMPROVEMENTS

In compliance with Public Law 97-248, the Airport and Airway Improvement Act, a notice of formal public hearing for Ft. Yukon Airport is being offered at this time. A hearing will be held for the purpose of considering the economic, social and environmental effects of the development and its consistency with the goals and objectives of such urban planning as has been carried out by the community. The meeting will be held at 6:30 p.m. in the Museum at Ft. Yukon, Alaska on January 22, 1990.

The State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities is proposing to upgrade the airport at Ft. Yukon. The existing float pond (Hospital Lake) and parking area does not meet Federal Aviation Administration requirements for safety. The existing runway is creating dusty conditions and runs. The apron needs to be expanded to allow for more lease lots and a future partial parallel runway will be necessary to access the airport. Land will need to be acquired to protect the airport and allows for expansion.

Two projects, one each in FY 89 and FY 90, are being designed to address the deficiencies. The FY 89 project is float pond improvements and will upgrade the float pond access road and construct a ramp aircraft parking area. An Environmental Assessment is being prepared and a draft will be available to the public by December 22, 1989 at State of Alaska, Department of Transportation and Public Facilities, Environmental Section, 2701 Peleg Road, MS 2554-08.

The second project in FY 90 will construct a new asphalt apron and resurface the runway. Dust control measures will be examined for the runway.

The FY 90 float pond project will have wetland and floodplain involvement and will comply with Executive Order 11990, Protection of Wetlands and Executive Order 11881, Floodplain Management.
