Girls State Adopts Resolution on D-2

The Alaskan American Legion Auxiliary's Girls State has adopted a joint resolution on the management of Federal lands in Alaska. Congressmen Don Young presented this resolution to the House today for entry into the Congressional Record.

The resolution, based on the contention that Alaska's future is inexorably tied to the use

of Federal lands in Alaska, "urges the U.S. Congress to place Alaska's D-2 lands in a system or systems which will allow and promote flexible management to insure that Alaska lands are protected."

Most importantly, the resolution urges management that "will also provide the opportunity for appropriate development of resources contained on these lands."

This resolution demonstrates that the young people of Alaska who know their home, are concerned about the future of their state and nation," Young said. "I welcome the opportunity to introduce this resolution into the House Record.
