

ANF Center Receives Funding

The Center for Equality of Opportunity in Schooling, established in Anchorage last year by the Alaska Native Foundation, has been funded for a second year by the U.S. Office of Education.

The purpose of the Center is to provide technical assistance to school districts in providing multi-cultural and non-sexist education programs. Services are provided at no cost to the district, but are paid by the Office of Education under the terms of the \$318,000 contract awarded the Foundation.

According to the Center's director, Bob Arnold, services available to districts include providing information, planning assessing needs and conducting workshops in cross-cultural understanding, human relations, and on multi-cultural and bias-free curriculum materials.
