## Stiff Fine-False Application for Fishing License Costly

Alaska resident sport fishing licenses generally cost each of us \$5.00, but on special occasions the price can be somewhat higher.

Paul Turner, of Kodiak, pleaded guilty in Kodiak District Court August 27, 1969 to the charge of making a false statement on an application for a resident license. The result was a fine of \$200.00.

District Officer Elliot J. Peterson making a routine spot check of license applications cited Paul Turner August 22, 1969 for claiming he had lived in Alaska 1 year and 2 months when in fact it was less than 10 months.

Increased investigation has revealed that one person claimed 10 years residency when in fact it was only a few months. Th law is specific and a declaratio on the license is very meaningfu and committing.
