

YUKON BRIDGE

JUNEAU—Bid advertising for construction of the first major permanent structure directly associated with the North Slope Road and the trans-Alaska pipeline commenced recently when the Alaska Department of Highways issued a call for bids on construction of a 2,300-foot bridge across the Yukon River, Governor William A. Egan announced recently.

The bridge, to be located north of Livengood, will carry not only vehicular traffic, but the 48" trans-Alaska pipeline as well. In discussing the project Governor Egan said Alyeska Pipeline Service Company and the State of Alaska will jointly share costs of construction of the Yukon River bridging.

Alyeska had originally planned to cross under the Yukon; however, cost projections showed that a saving could be realized by attaching the pipeline to the bridge.
