Regulations to be the subject of action by the Joint Boards and the Department of Fish and Game in this Part II are in Chapter 95 of Title 5, Alaska Administrative Code, and concern comprehensive fish and game habitat protection measures.

The Boards of Fisheries and Game and the Commissioner, acting jointly, may promulgate comprehensive requisitions governing activities in fish streams and state game refuges, sanctuaries and critical habitat areas,
