

Canadian Indian Chiefs Discuss Common Problems

Canadian Indian Chiefs from Yukon Territory to Northern British Columbia, met at Whitehorse, Y.T. on Jan. 26, 27 and 28 for the first time to discuss common problems.

Eighteen Chiefs, including one woman, discussed need for unity and a desire to organize so they could voice their common problems and to seek solutions for those problems.

Among other topics, they discussed education, preservation of Indian Culture, and the Indian Land Claims Commission.

The group decided to have another meeting on June 13 for organizational purposes.

It was indicated that the group might be called Yukon Native Brotherhood.
