

# AT&T connects schools to info

AT&T Corp. recently announced that it will invest \$150 million to help connect the 110,000 public and private elementary and secondary schools in the United States to the information superhighway, including Internet access, by 2000.

The plan, called the AT&T Learning Network, begins next spring. It includes free dial-up Internet access, 100 hours of free

usage and free "browser" software, used to navigate the huge computer network. It will also provide three months of national voice messaging. The voice messaging service will allow schools to broadcast messages to parents and pupils. The project will be expanded to include libraries next year.
