

Rural Alaska Honor Institute now accepting applications

The Rural Alaska Honor Institute (RAHI) challenge is for young scholars only. RAHI permits you to get an early start on college by taking college courses and earning seven to nine college credits before you enroll as a full-time UAF student. Credits earned at RAHI will count toward the Baccalaureate Degree.

You'll take intensive college freshman writing, study skills development, Native dance or swimming, and orientation to college. You'll

choose from among several career specialty courses such as biology, business management, or petroleum engineering, plus math or Native studies. You'll also be able to take UAF Summer Sessions courses while at RAHI. You'll be awarded a full scholarship valued at between \$7,000 and \$8,000. The scholarship will cover all summer program expenses including travel, room, board and supplies. It's for you if:

- you are a high school junior or senior;

- you are an Alaska Native student living in a rural community (others may also apply)

- you have a 3.0 GPA or better

- you are committed to earning a college degree and you appreciate the opportunity to earn college credits at RAHI

- you recognize that very hard work is required to be a RAHI scholar

RAHI is not for you if: you are just look-

ing for a way to get out of your village; or are simply looking for something to do for the summer.
