In the interim, the current bilateral interim, the current bilateral Executive agreement on fishing has been extended until April 24, 1977. The issue to greatest significance to Alaska is how the U.S. and Canada will coordinate management of intermingling salmon stocks, Sen. Stevens said.

The Organization for the Management of Alaska's Resources (OMAR) made a three-day trip to Washington this week to gain support in Congress for the all-Alaska gasline

The group met with the Alaska congressional delegation to map out a campaign strategy, and they were briefed on the status and prospects of the line by representatives of various federal

agencies.

Members of the OMAR group met with individual senators and congressmen during their visit to present Alaska's case in favor of the all-Alaska route, and the delegation hosted a reception for all members of Congress to meet informally with the OMAR informally
