

Emmonak student picked for scholarship

ANCHORAGE--An Emmonak high school student has been named winner of one of ten \$1,000 scholarships offered by Atlantic Richfield Company in a statewide competition.

The ten winners, and three alternates, were selected from nearly 300 entrants in the competition. The winners list was announced by Howard A. Slack, Atlantic Richfield's vice president and resident manager for

Alaska. The scholarship money may be used at any college or university inside or outside Alaska.

The 1978 winner from Emmonak is Malora J. Charles, Emmonak High School. Other Alaskan winners include: Joanne Marie Carlson, Lathrop High School, Fairbanks; Timothy James Pearson, Nome/Beltz High School; and Doug Bates, Wrangell High School. Also

included were Tove Arleen Aune, East High School; Blase Alan Burkhardt, East High School; Larry J. Gipson, East High School; Brian G. Hoefler, West High School; Karen Reed, Service High School; and Emanuel E. Washington, West High School, all in Anchorage.

The three alternates, who will each receive a \$100 savings bond, are Paul Gerald Ossowski, Kodiak High School; Rebecca

Ann Rempel, Palmer High School; and Linda Susan Noatak of Nunivak Island, a senior at Mt. Edgecumbe High School.

The scholarship selection committee was comprised of William J. Tobin, associate editor and general manager of the Anchorage Times; John Murphy, principal of Bayshore School in Anchorage; Lucille Frey, educational consultant; and Tom Brennan, public relations man-

ager for Atlantic Richfield Company in Alaska.

Slack explained the scholarship program is aimed at providing educational assistance to Alaskan youths showing leadership potential or the capacity to make significant contributions to the state. Other considerations were scholastic achievement, character, seriousness of purpose and educational goals.
