NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION

Notice is given that the ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION, under authority vested by AS 42.05.151(a), proposes to adopt regulations in Title 3 of the Alaska Administrative Code to implement and make specific AS 42.05.141, 42.05.151, 42.05.291, 42.05.331, 42.05.451, 42.05.511, and 42.05.701, as follows:

AAC 52 is amended by adding Article 3 (sections 160-310, inclusive) which establishes service standards to ensure that reasonable, continuous, uninterrupted and undelayed telephone service will be rendered to the public. Where appropriate, the standards define service levels that generally indicate the point at which there is need for corrective action to be taken by the utility.

The proposed regulations would require that telephone utilities adhere to the standards and practices in the following areas, including but not limited to:

- *location and staffing of telephone company business offices;
- *procedures to be used when a utility is unable to provide requested service.
- *subscriber billing;
- *location of public telephones;
- *dialing instructions on public telephones;
- *requirement of dial tone on public telephones to permit caller to reach certain emergency services free of charge;
- *telephone directory publication dates and information;
- *disconnection of a subscriber for imposing charges on its customers for the use of the telephone services which exceed the approved rates in the utility's tariff;
- *engineering and maintenance of telephone plant;
- *design of intertie trunks in accordance with the requirements of the nationwide switching plan;
- *limitations on multi-party service on rural exchange lines;
- *objectives for toll operator answering performance;
- *maximum installation and repair service response times;
- *maximum dial tone delays;
- *maximum limits for failures and blockages of attempted calls;
- *reporting requirements for telephone utilities, including projected capital improvement programs and planning statements.
