Alascom Green Sense III Promotion — Alascom will waive the Alascom Green Sense Promotion monthly recurring charge for the first two complete bill cycles after the Customer enrolls in this promotion.

NOTICE OF UTILITY TARIFF REVISION

The ALASKA PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION gives notice that UNITED UTILITIES, INC. (UUI), a local exchange telephone company, has filed a tariff revision (TA28-249) in which it proposes to add Multi-Line Hunt Group service and to make other additions, deletions, revisions, and textual changes to various sections of its tariff.

This notice does not contain a complete description of all the proposed revisions; some of the proposed changes are described in more detail below.

- UUI proposed to add Multi-Line Hunt Group service to its tariff. UUI defines this feature as:
A service offered by the Utility for a specific type of Hunt Group arrangement. In a Multi-Line Hunt Group, one directory number is assigned to receive incoming calls for a group of lines. Hunting starts from the pilot number and continues in a sequential manner to the last line in the group looking for an idle line. If none is found, the caller will receive a busy signal.

UUI proposes a \$2.00/month recurring charge for this feature.

- UUI proposes to add Controlled Call Waiting service to its tariff. UUI defines this feature as:
A custom calling feature that is the same as Call Waiting with the additional capability, where the Utility's switch has the appropriate software, of allowing the subscriber to enable and disable the Call Waiting feature manually.

UUI Proposes a \$1.50/month recurring charge for this feature.

- UUI proposes to add the following provisions and conditions to the Conditions Section and the Custom Calling Feature Section of its tariff.

CONDITIONS

—One Service Order Charge applies when a customer subscribes to Multi-Line Hunt Group (and/or Billing Control Feature and/or Custom Calling Features). In addition, a non-recurring Central Office Line Connection charge applies.

CUSTOM CALLING FEATURE

—Recurring charges for Custom Calling Features are in addition to all other applicable recurring charges as specified...[elsewhere in the tariff].

If after investigation the Commission finds that a rate or classification different from that proposed by UUI is reasonable, the Commission may approve a rate or classification which varies from that proposed.
