This great event is dedicated to the preservation of native culture and to identifying physical fitness and friendly competition between the native citizens of our great State.

Therefore, I, William A. Egan, Governor of Alaska, do hereby urge all citizens of this State to cooperate and participate to the fullest extent possible in the annual

WORLD ESKIMO OLYMPICS

to be held on July 27, 28, and 29, 1972, and I further commend the fine people of Fairbanks for undertaking and sponsoring the annual staging of this event.
