

Two Contracts

JUNEAU The state has awarded two contracts totaling \$368,565 for dock and harbor improvements at Haines, Hoonah, Gustavus, and Point Couverdon, Governor William A. Egan said today.

A \$97,020 contract awarded to Western Marine Construction Co. of Seattle provides for maintenance dredging of the Haines small boat harbor, in which approximately 20,000 cubic yards of material will be removed and disposed of in deep water.

The project will be coordinated with the Department of Fish and Game, a Public Works Department official said, to assure that there will be no adverse effect on fish in the area.

The work is to be completed in late September.

A \$271,545 project awarded to T. O. Paddock Co. of Juneau includes at Hoonah removal of the existing seaplane float from an oil company dock and equipping the float with its own approach and gangway nearer the small boat harbor, and reconstruction of floats in the harbor that are in need of repair; at Gustavus reconstruction of the dock, and addition of a small boat mooring float; and at Point Couverdon dredging and marking of shallow spots in Swanson Harbor to provide a refuge for small boats travelling between Chatham and Icy Straits.

The work is to be completed in late September.
