

Stevens praises U.S.-Soviet arms agreement

WASHINGTON — Sen. Ted Stevens said recently that the proposed U.S.-Soviet arms control agreement announced by President Reagan could lead to a new relationship between the nations.

Stevens said the agreement is balanced and fair.

"I believe this agreement will lead to an increased feeling of trust between the two nations that could result in a new era in our relationship," Stevens said.

Stevens is co-chairman of the Senate Observers Group to the Arms Control talks.
