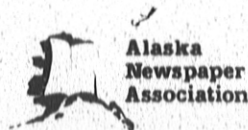

HERE'S HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS:

1. The state is divided into five regions: Southeast (the panhandle south from Yakutat); Western/Arctic (the area north and west of the Alaska range, except Fairbanks); the City and Borough of Fairbanks; the Municipality of Anchorage; and Southcentral (the remaining area, including Kodiak Island).
2. In late January, judges from each region will pick two noteworthy finalists from the region they represent. The selections will be based on the accomplishments of the individuals in their own sports.
3. On February 20, ten judges, two from each region, will meet to select the Sportsperson.
4. the 1984 Sportsperson of the Year will receive the Denali Award, which commemorates Walter Harper, an Athabaskan Indian, who was the first person to reach the summit of Mount McKinley.

RULES:

1. Nominations must be postmarked by January 18, 1985.
2. The outline of reasons for nominations must not exceed two double-spaced typewritten pages.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO BE NOMINATED?

1. Sportsperson must be an Alaska resident or must be noted for his or her sporting accomplishments in Alaska.
2. He or she can be a coach, athlete or outdoorsperson— anyone who engages in a sporting activity. However, only individuals— not teams— can qualify.
3. Notable performances must have been January 1 through December 31, 1984.
