 The Red Cloud Indian Art Show is sponsored annually by the Heritage Center in South Dakota. This year the 17th annual show runs from June 9 through August 11, 1985. There are five divisions: paintings, water color paintings, graphics, mixed media and three dimensional works. Each division has a merits award. There are also purchase awards and special awards. All works must be for sale and be made by a living artist within the last two years. Indian, Eskimo and Aleut artists are eligible. The deadline for letting them know you are entering work is May 1, 1985 and the work must be at Red Cloud Indian School before May 22, 1985. • The Institute of Alaska Native Arts has scheduled an Alaska Native Basketry Exhibit for July 13 through September 15, 1985 at the University of Alaska Museum in Fairbanks. The exhibit will be dedicated to Selina Peratrovich, Haida basketmaker, recently deceased, who was a lifelong basketmaker and who had been selected to be involved in the exhibit.

The exhibit will feature work by 21 basketmakers who are making baskets especially for this exhibit. Each of the seven indigenous cultures of the State of Alaska will have their baskets represented. Baskets of the style made by Aleut, Athabascan, Tlingit, Haida, Tsimshian, Inupiaq Eskimo and Yupik Eskimo artists will be represented. Not only baskets will be on display, the exhibit will also depict

through photographs and text, the gathering of materials, the processes involved in preparing the material, and basketry techniques.

Demonstrations by seven of the basketmakers are planned for September. The basketmakers will be in residence at the University of Alaska Museum for one week to do demonstrations and to gather for a symposium September 9 through 13. Following the University of Alaska Museum showing the exhibit will travel statewide.
