The Kenaitze lost their tradi-

tional and cultural fishing rights under the former Board of Fish and Game ruling; we also believe that everyone in the State has a right to subsistence fish. Further, how long will it be before the "rural" label is removed from those villages and they, to, become "urban"?

The Alaska Federation of Natives purports to speak for all the Natives of Alaska. In supporting subsistence fishing for rural Alaskans only, what are they trying to say?
