1. Wrote, sponsored and passed bill for the Constitutional Convention leading to Alaska Statehood.
2. Wrote, sponsored and passed first Fair Employee Practices Act in Alaska history.
3. Wrote, sponsored and passed first public housing bill in history of Alaska.
4. Wrote, sponsored and passed bill establishing the Territorial Police.
5. Wrote, sponsored and passed first policemen's and fishermen's retirement bill in the history of Alaska.
6. Co-authored, sponsored and passed oil severance tax bill during past legislative session.
